Lisa Francesca Rail is currently researching seasonal pasture commons in the Austrian Alps as part of her PhD project at the University of Vienna. Prior to this, during her graduate studies at McGill University, she conducted research on collective pasture use and management in Northern Kyrgyzstan.



Iuliia Eremenko is an Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Political Science and International Studies at the University of Warsaw. She holds a PhD from the University of Bamberg, Germany. In her work, she investigates how citizen engagement can influence the decision-making processes regarding the preservation and management of cultural heritage sites.



Bidisha Banerji is an Associate Professor and Deputy Director working at the Amity Institute of Public Policy of the Amity University NOIDA with a PhD in Public Policy and Public Administration from The George Washington University.
